CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 11th - 17th May

During Christian Aid Week, please pray for the people and country of Guatemala, which is the focus of the week this year. More than half the population work in agriculture, yet Guatemala is a hunger hotspot. It has one of the highest rates globally of stunted development in children. It is one of the ten countries in the world rated most vulnerable to climate emergencies.

In the Alta Verapaz region, uncertainty looms. Deadly droughts, savage storms and industrial plantations that monopolise the water supply and deforest the land, threaten the community's livelihoods, traditions, even their survival. As a result, crops are failing, plunging farming families into hunger and poverty. However, the unstoppable power of hope is in the hands of farmers like Aurelia (featured in the Christian Aid Week resources) who's leading her community to overcome these challenges.

Pray for these farmers, who have sought solutions and who attend specialist agricultural training, to adapt their farming to the changing climate. They are shown how to grow climate resilient crops, produce fertiliser and build rainwater collection systems. Christian Aid's partner, Congcoop, provides the specialist agricultural training.

Lord we pray that more farmers, like Aurelia, will gain skills and knowledge so they can build their resilience to extreme weather and take back control of their harvests.

Letter from the Elders



Dear Friends,

As I sit and write this letter, the sun is shining, and the spring gardens all around are looking really good this year. As the sun is warming the earth, the fish in our pond are coming up to see if there is any food to be had.

In the garden the fruit trees are full of blossom, and its nice to see and hear the bees and flying insects visiting each flower. We also have a gooseberry bush, we have grown it from a cutting. It is one that has lots of very sharp thorns and prickles. To look at it, there is not a lot going on, and looks like an unproductive twig or two, but amazingly the flowers which are so tiny, almost unseen, are producing small fruits which are beginning to form.

This small prickly bush which looks like it is struggling, is still producing fruit. As I ponder some of the similarities between my Christian growth and this bush, I am reminded of lessons learnt from the bible: How God called Moses to free the Israelites from within a burning bush. The flowers so tiny almost unseen: Faith as small as a mustard seed, can, in the name of Jesus move mountains. As for struggling, most of us whether young or old will have, or continue to have, varying degrees of difficulty to overcome. Also at times, we too may be somewhat prickly to those around us. But each of us is still bearing fruit, as we share the Good News of Jesus' birth, life, and as we have just celebrated this Easter, His resurrection.

It says in 2 Corinthians chapter 12 verse 9 "My Grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness". Such amazing Grace. May each of us continue to know His Grace throughout all our days.





MAY DAY WALK -MONDAY 5th MAY

park (grid ref SU308024), which is about 200m along a gravel track off of the Balmer Lawn Road behind the Balmer Lawn Hotel.

Directions: From Beaulieu take B3055 to Brockenhurst. Approaching Brockenhurst continue ahead past Mill Lane and pass under the railway bridge. After 600m at the left-hand bend in the road, turn SHARP RIGHT onto the gravel track. The car park is 200m along the track.

The **walk** is about 5km (3.1 miles) long and will take about 1½-1¾ hours. It's mostly along gravel tracks, but waterproof shoes or boots are advised.

DRAMA LLAMAS



Hello everyone, I hope you are all enjoying a lovely Spring time. This is my favourite time of year as the days get longer and warmer and our garden starts to bloom. It is also the Eastertide which for me is a very important time, probably more so than Christmas. It

definitely has a different feeling to Christmas which as you know is Jesus birthday. Whilst the birth of a baby is an everyday occurrence, in fact we have all been born, Jesus is the only person I am aware of who has ever been resurrected. For me, Easter is a time of contemplation and gratitude as I consider the sacrifice God and Jesus made for us all.




We hope you enjoyed our last performance which starred Naomi and Bobby. I am very proud of them both as they brought the sketch to life, making many of you laugh and hopefully carrying a clear message to you all. Nick had written the original script which we then tweaked very slightly. In particular, Bobby made a joke

by mispronouncing Matt Le Tissier's name which I could see made Nick chuckle. Again we had a little glitch with the microphones which seems to be a recurring theme with our dramas so maybe we need to look at this again. Don't worry, I won't bore you with all the technical details, as if I'm honest, I haven't got a clue!

By the time you read this, our next Drama Llama item will be over and done with. Which for me will be a huge relief as it will be a monologue performed by yours truly. Thankfully I have had the support of our Director aka Ray who has hopefully helped me to bring this sketch to life. Ray did offer to be on stage with me, however I actually work better alone as it changes how I perform. Working with others means I have to remember set lines or actions which as you know I find really hard. In fact, even for my previous monologues, I have used the cunning technique of having a script hidden as a prop.

This time with Ray's help, I have approached things slightly differently by using my version of method acting, immersing myself into my character. Don't get me wrong, I have also had to learn my lines as otherwise it could turn into a chaotic mess. The difference is that I have focused on the meaning of what I am saying rather than the specific words. I have also been praying about it and have handed it all over to God. I feel sorry for Ray's neighbours as they would have heard me run

through it a dozen times the other day in his garden. I have even run through it whilst riding my friend's horse, Red, in the forest. I dread to think what Red thought of me!



You may notice a slight similarity between the ending of this drama and the one Bobby and I performed for Pentecost. Both end with us stating we need to carry God's message. Such a simple task, or is it? I know when I first started my relationship with God that I would have

switched off if someone preached about Jesus resurrection to me. I was not in a place where I could hear what was being said, let alone understand it. For me it was enough just to know that God existed and hearing my friends share about their relationship with Him helped me to see this. I am very grateful that those in my family who have a Christian faith never tried to preach to me about it. My uncle is a minister and I have recently found out that my grandmother was an Elder in her local United Reformed church. Both my grandmother and my uncle carried a gentle message of God's love to me so that when I was ready, I only had to open the door slightly to let Him in.

I am continuing to read the Old Testament and am currently reading Kings. I am finding the difference between the Old and New Testaments quite interesting, although they are both instruction books on how we could live our lives. Notice my use of the word 'could' rather than 'should', as what the Old Testament has taught me is how easy it is for us to choose to step away from God rather than walk with Him.

I have had difficulty working out how to use one of the knitting machines I was given. Even after a year, I still struggle to knit anything properly and have ended up starting about a hundred different projects and finishing just one of them. When I first got the machine, Bobby suggested that I read the instructions but of course I didn't do that. The other day, after numerous failed attempts at trying to knit a sample square, I gave in and read the instructions. Low and behold, I managed to knit the sample in one go. Reading instructions works! It made me realise how the Bible, especially the New Testament is like God's instruction manual for our lives. So rather than just have it sitting looking pretty on my shelf, I should put the action in, start to read it (which you all know I have been) and follow the instructions. As they say, faith without works is dead.

As usual, I have absolutely no idea what we will be doing for our next Drama Llama production as I would like to get the monologue over and done with first. DOUBLE JEOPARDY

"Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Romans 5 v 1

In the legal system, there is something known as 'the law of double jeopardy'. It means that, except in some very specific circumstances, you can't be tried twice for the same crime. Now, let's apply this principle to your salvation. Jesus has already been tried and punished for your sins – all of them! So don't let Satan, the accuser, convince you that God will also punish you for them and send you to hell.

Christ's last words on the cross, 'It is finished,' are translated in the Greek text as 'paid in full'. All your sins – past, present and future – were atoned for at Calvary. Think of the word 'finished'. Imagine a master carpenter putting the finishing touches to a beautiful table. Would you take a wood plane and say, 'I think I can make this look a little better and give it a little more value?' The carpenter would say, 'Stop; if you touch it, you will ruin it!' And they would be right. The same goes for your salvation. You can add nothing to it, but by trying to merit it by your performance and good works, you can definitely take something away from it.

The word *justified* simply means declared or made righteous in the sight of God. The moment you place your trust in Christ as your Saviour, *that's* how God sees you. 'Therefore, having been justified by faith [not works, human effort, or performance], we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand' (vv. 1-2). How can you stand before God clothed in grace? By faith in Christ alone and nothing else.
